

By bus

Six public bus routes serve the airport exclusively, connecting the greater area of Athens and Piraeus with the airport.

The Conference Venue is accessible from the airport via **Line E95**: Athens Airport – Syntagma Square Express.

The bus stops from Athens International Airport are:

- Arrivals Terminal
- Pyrgos
- Panagitsa
- Ag. Paraskevis Square
- 7th Chologou
- Metro Station "Ethniki Amyna" (Metro Line 3)
- Zagora/Karanika
- Galaxias
- Mavili Sq.
- Hilton
- Stadio
- **Syntagma**

At Syntagma take the Metro from Syntagma Metro station and go Metaxourgio Metro station (**Metro Line 2**, Red Line).

Travel time: Approximately 40-50 minutes, depending on the traffic.

Price: A one-way airport ticket costs 2.90 € and can be bought from the ticket kiosk at the airport, from the bus driver, as well as at all metro stations and public transport ticket outlets.

Frequency of Departures: 10 to 20 minutes depending upon time of day

Operating hours: 24 hours

By taxi

Travel time: The average journey from the airport to the city centre should take approximately 40-50 minutes, depending on the traffic.

Price: approx 30 €

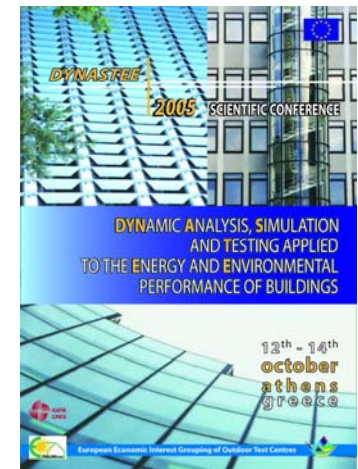

How to reach the conference venue



International flights arrive at the Athens International Airport "Eleftherios Venizelos" <http://www.aia.gr> located 33 km southeast of Athens and approximately 40-minute drive to city centre.

By Metro

The Metro in Athens is pristine, fast and efficient and the Venue can be easily reached from the airport as it is conveniently located close to a Metro station.

The **Athens Imperial Hotel** is located opposite the Metaxourghio Metro station and is accessible from the airport via **Metro Line 3** (Blue Line): Athens International Airport – Monastiraki.

The **Metro Line 3**

stations from Athens International Airport are:

- Athens International Airport
- Doukissis Plakentias
- Halandri
- Ethniki Amyna
- Katehaki
- Panormou
- Ambelokipi
- Megaro Mousikis
- Evangelismos
- **Syntagma**
- Monastiraki

At Syntagma, change to the **Metro Line 2** (Red Line):

Syntagma - Aghios Antonios, in order to go to the Metaxourghio Metro station.

- Syntagma
- Panepistimio
- Omonia
- **Metaxourghio**

Frequency of departures: Direct departures to and from central Athens and the Airport are every 30 minutes.

Travel time: 30 minutes to Syntagma and a further 10 minutes to Metaxourghio station.

Price: A one-way airport ticket costs 6 € and can be purchased from the ticket kiosk at the airport and in all Metro stations.

Operating hours: All metro lines operate daily from 5:30-24:00. Every 3 minutes during rush hours (7:30-10:00 & 14:00-16:30), every 5 minutes during normal daytime service and every 10 minutes early morning and late evening.

Useful tips: Inside the Metro, stations announcements are made before every stop. Metro tickets are sold at the automatic ticket machines installed in all Metro stations as well as at the ticket booths. At the present, machines will only accept coins and give change. Remember to validate your ticket before proceeding to the platform.
